FACT SHEET 2008



We are a non-profit, community-supported, charitable organization committed to feeding the hungry of Cape Ann.

Our mission is to alleviate hunger.

We accomplish this by providing free meals and food in a hospitable environment, providing advocacy on behalf of the disadvantaged, and providing job skills training and job placement through our programs.

What we do

<u>Food Pantry</u> provided free canned goods, fresh produce, meats, bread, milk and eggs for **291,568** meals to **1,472** households representing **3,692** people.

Community Meals served 17,130 hot meals to guests needing food and companionship.

<u>Mobile Market</u>, a free farmers' market, provided **97,024 pounds** of fresh produce and groceries to **354 households** representing **1,192 people** at **four locations** in Gloucester and Rockport.

<u>Senior Market</u> provided **23,096 pounds** of groceries and fresh produce to **219 households** representing **259 seniors** in Gloucester and Rockport.

<u>Buck-a-Bag Market</u>, a weekly surplus food market, provided low-cost access to **42,082 pounds** of fresh (and locally grown) produce and wholesome breads.

<u>Summer Food Service Program</u> served **4,131 lunches** to children ages 1-18 at six sites on Cape Ann during a ten-week summer lunch program.

<u>Holiday Meals Program</u> distributed **1,062 turkey meal baskets** to provide **6,372 meals**.



<u>Collaborative Meals</u> supplied **31,777 pounds** of groceries and fresh produce to clients of the North Shore Health Project, Wellspring House, Action Shelter, SeniorCare Meals-On-Wheels, Harvest Meals, and the Chill Zone.

<u>Food Stamps Outreach</u> handled **322 appointments** for Food Stamp application assistance.

<u>Cape Ann SERVE</u>, a local chapter of SERVE New England, promoted volunteerism through a food buying cooperative program that utilizes locally grown and produced food.

<u>Second Glance Resale Shop</u> sold **211,855 low-cost clothing and household items** to the community, honored **174 referral requests** from other agencies, recycled **8,261 bags of clothing** through Salvation Army, hosted F1rstJobs, Community Enterprise and STEP program participants for job training, and raised revenues to support our hunger-relief programs.
