GLOUCESTER –The giving season officially began this morning at The Open Door Autumn Breakfast.

From 7:30-9 a.m., approximately 200 people gathered at the Beauport Hotel on Commercial Street to honor The Open Door Autumn Breakfast award winners, and kickstart the nonprofit's Holiday Basket and Thanksgiving Food Drive programs.

"It is simple and practical acts of service or kindness right where we are that make the biggest difference. Now coming into the months when we celebrate and give thanks, there are families in our community who are struggling to make ends meet," President and CEO Julie LaFontaine said. "Your support is needed. With rising energy costs and grocery bills climbing, people will need help to set the table for the holidays."

Last year, The Open Door distributed 2,267 Holiday Baskets for Thanksgiving and the winter holidays to local people.
