GLOUCESTER – Second Glance, Thrift Store of The Open Door, expands its store in Gloucester today with a ribbon cutting for a second building, SG Home.

The Open Door President and CEO Julie LaFontaine, Director of Thrift Operations Susan Zwart, members of The Open Door Board of Directors, staff, volunteers, and members of the public gathered at 2 Pond Road at 9 a.m. on Saturday for the opening of the new space, where Mahaneys Uechi Karate Academy previously operated.

SG Home will operate in the Pond Road Plaza alongside the main thrift store, Second Glance, Wednesday through Saturday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. with seasonal Sunday hours.

"From a tiny closet to a shop spanning two buildings, the growth of Second Glance, the Thrift Store of The Open Door, is a testament to a community that thrives on helping one another," President and CEO Julie LaFontaine said. "We wouldn't be here without our shoppers or donors, who choose Second Glance knowing their dollars and treasures generate revenue to help feed local people."

SG Home will feature furniture and home décor for every room in the house including pillows, linens, vases, and other decorative items, as well as a selection of art.

"Second Glance is so much more than a store. It's a community of people that love art, design, and history. They know the value of reducing waste by second-hand shopping and spending dollars with businesses that have a positive impact," Director of Thrift Operations Susan Zwart said. "SG Home is a natural opportunity for us to grow and raise more revenue for hunger-relief programs that people rely on, especially with inflation and rising food costs."

Clothing, accessories, jewelry, handbags, shoes, books, and games and a smaller selection of home décor will continue to be sold at Second Glance's main building in the Pond Road Plaza as well.

Second Glance's Donation Center has also moved alongside the SG Home building for more convenient donations.

Second Glance is expected to generate 25% of The Open Door's \$4.5 million cash operating budget this year.
